



***Our 15 Millionth Patient
Abdul Rehman – after successful surgery***

Abdul Rehman is the only male child of Abdul Hakeem and was born after two daughters. The parents were overjoyed at the birth of a baby boy who they hoped would be their support in their old age. However their happiness was short lived because when the child started growing they realized that he was blind in both eyes. Their hopes and dreams were shattered. They did not know what to do. Mr. Hakeem works at a shanty hotel in village Killy Badini, District Noshki (Balochistan) and earns a meager sum of Rs.4000/-(\$ 50) per month which was barely enough for food. They resigned themselves to the situation and accepted the blindness of the child as fate.

However when Master Rehman was three, the father was persuaded by some people who also met the expense, to take the child to Quetta to a doctor for examination. The doctor gave some medicines for three months which had no effect whatsoever. The parents were now in deep depression. Then a friend of Hakeem who worked in Quetta came back to the village for a visit. Seeing the state of the child he advised the father to take him to LRBT's Eye Hospital in Quetta, where all treatment including surgery is provided absolutely free of cost by highly qualified and experienced doctors.

The child was brought to LRBT's Quetta hospital. Examination revealed that he was suffering from congenital cataract in both eyes which was curable by a simple surgery. The child was operated in one eye. Upon opening the bandage, the father showed him a piece of roti (bread) which he grabbed. The parents' joy knew no bounds. Their fervent prayers had been answered. A miracle had happened. Their only son had emerged from a life of perpetual darkness. Master Rehman's other eye will be operated after three months.

LRBT FREE SECONDARY EYE HOSPITAL AT ARIFWALA

Construction work at our Arifwala Hospital is nearing completion.

LRBT signed an Agreement with LRBT America for funding the entire equipment for our Arifwala hospital. All the equipment has been ordered. LRBT America has also agreed to fund the operating expenses of the hospital

This hospital will be opened for patients by mid November 2008.

LRBT FREE SECONDARY EYE HOSPITAL AT MANSEHRA

75% of civil works have been completed. Equipment will be ordered by October 2008. The hospital is expected to be opened by January 2009 when the existing temporary hospital will be closed.

EXPANSION WORK AT KHANEWAL AND TANDO BAGO HOSPITALS

Expansion work at Tando Bago and on the first phase of Khanewal hospital is progressing steadily and is expected to be completed by December and October 2008 respectively.

Mr. Nasir Ahmed from Dubai has committed to fund the construction cost of the second phase i.e., wards at Khanewal Hospital

An anonymous donor in UK committed to fund the cost overrun of the expansion at Tando Bago, due to escalation in prices of steel, cement and other materials. The donor has also committed to fund some of the equipment at Tando Bago, Rashidabad and Khanewal hospitals.

A total of 931 Patients were examined, out of which 746 were medicated, 405 refracted and 135 referred to our hospitals for detailed examination and/or surgery.

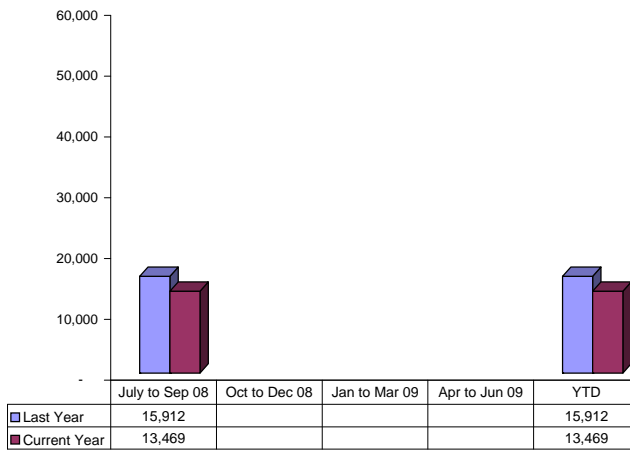

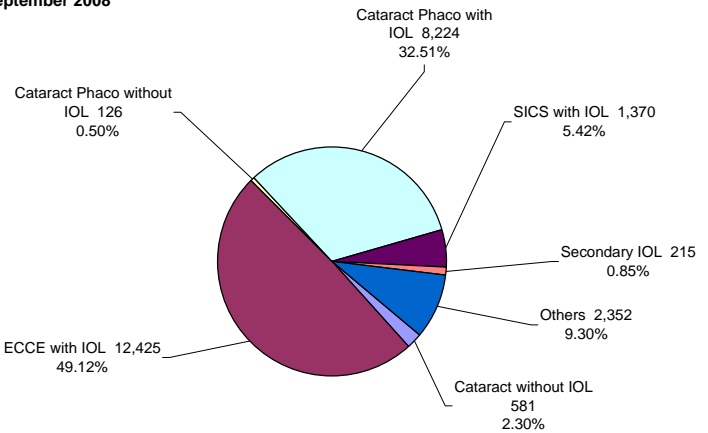
